#### **Otterton Footpath and Rights of Way Report for March 2021**

### General

- 1. Devon County Council has continued their repairs, improvements and maintenance of our footpaths. Brilliant! Many thanks to Sam Jeffcoat and his team.
- 2. The breach in the river bank just north of Clamour Bridge is to be repaired once permissions have been obtained.
- 3. As in common with many other areas, lockdown has seen a lot more people than usual during the winter out and about exercising on the footpath and rights of ways. Some paths have widened considerably and some people are trespassing to avoid mud. See below
- 4. All the world war memorial waymarks and finger posts are now in position. They add considerably to the historic context of our lovely environment. There are 16WW1 and 2 WW2 posts. Many thanks to Toby for placing them. When funds allow the remaining 5 WW2 names of the fallen will be marked.
- 5. As can be expected at this time of year many of the PROW were very muddy in December but have dried up considerably due to the recent drier weather.

## **Major Issues**

- 6. River Otter footpath 1
  - a. The Lower Otter Restoration Project has started; What to expect in the next few weeks:
    - a.i. Site set up for ground investigations started on 15 March 2021
    - a.ii. Ground investigation works started on 22 March 2021
    - a.iii. Planned completion of this phase is end April 2021
  - b. Goggle their web site for more information and newsletter
  - c. There will presumable be some temporary diversions to the footpaths later in the year to enable construction

#### **Minor Issues**

- One of the new WW1 posts was damaged at the top of Watering Lane (permitted footpath) during hedge trimming. This post has now been replaced. The old post marked to commemorate Ernest Hart is not badly damaged – if anyone knows any of his relatives let me know so they could be offered the removed post.
- 8. More no cycling signs have been placed to give errant cyclists even less excuse to cycle footpaths.

## Trees

- 9. Nothing significant to report.
- 10. A survey of Stantyway Trees will be carried out once they are in leaf.
- 11. The last of the ash trees to be removed this winter has been felled. A very neat job by Toby.
